



JUSTIN CARR was a young Renaissance Man who loved the visual and performing arts. He was four years old when he started his quest to achieve World Peace. On 2/22/2013, at 16, Justin died suddenly during swim practice at his school. He had an undiagnosed heart condition (cardiomyopathy), which resulted in his Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). SCA is the #1 Killer of student-athletes, contributes to the #2 Medical cause of death of individuals under the age of 25, and is the #1 cause of death on school campuses. JCWWP is a 501 (c) 3 created in his honor and as a memorial to his interests, hopes, and dreams for the world. JCWWP's mission supports Justin's blueprints he left behind, focusing on the three arc platforms and areas he excelled in (Art- visual and performing), dreamed of (Peace), and exhibited and succumbed to (Heart).

Amanda coined the phrase Heartquake™ to soften the trauma, shame, and blame felt bu manuheart disease survivors. Harriet Zaretsky

Harriet Zaretsky, originally from New York, earned her BS in Speech and Language Therapy at BU and her Master's at the U Mass at Amherst. After moving to Los Angeles in 1974, she worked for LAUSD for 11 years as an Aphasia teacher. Teaching special needs students reinforced her conviction that all children deserve the best childhoods we can give them She has heen a dedicated activist give them. She has been a dedicated activist in her community, consistently advocating for children and never wavening in pursuit of that passion.

Harriet became a lawyer in 1988. When her son, Dillon, was born in 1989, and her daughter, Taylor, was born in 1992, she continued her devotion to numerous community programs, leading fundraising efforts for their schools, her synagogue, Rustic Canyon Park, and organizing many local events. Harriet also obtained her Real Estate license and managed several hundred multi-family units.

She has been a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) since 1996. Besides giving her CASA children her expertise in court, she is active in trying to provide leadership in changing a flawed system that services abused, abandoned, or neglected children. Harriet was also Chairperson of the CASA LA Board of Directors. Last year, she joined the Board at Ready to Succeed, which helps foster college students graduate and find meaningful employment.

Harriet is President of The Dillon Henry Foundation (DHF), which honors her son Dillon's memory and passions. He died tragically in 2007. DHF partnered with other non-profits to work locally and around the world to improve the lives of children and work on environmental issues affecting our planet. In 2018, DHF built and opened a school in a Congo rural village for 566 children who had little opportunity for an education. The beautiful and safe learning setting offers two meals a day and provides opportunities to change the culture by helping bring gender equality, peace, and non-violence to the region.

As a devoted mother to Taylor and her son-in-law, Jace, Harriet welcomed her grandson Bodhi on 1/31/2024. She misses her husband of 45 years, Steve Henry, who passed away on 7/18/2023. https://dillonslist.org



Gary V. Lett
Gary V. Lett is the CEO of Lett's Do Art
Inc. and President of Lett's-Do-Art LLC. He
has been a working artist for over 40
years in Pomona, CA, where he has been
active in civic opportunities and nonprofits. His creative work has been
showcased throughout California and
Texas and has received numerous
awards. His artistic experience includes
custom ceramic tile murals, fabric art,
graphic design, illustration, and sculpture.
His most joyous moments come when
working with and teaching aspiring artists
from kindergarten to adulthood. For over
20 years, Garys career has focused on
education: directing after-school children's
art programs and teaching ceramic and
fabric art.

While living in San Antonio, Gary completed three major art projects and received state commendation for his work with children. The Art History annuals of San Antonio highlighted Gary as one of 25 Leading Artists in 2005. His artwork is honored in two books based on his Texas projects: Cow Parade San Antonio and Arte Del Pueblo: The Outdoor Public Art of San Antonio.

Gary was the sculpture and advanced hand-building teacher at the American Museum of Ceramic Art in Pomona, CA, and the sole drawing, painting, and digital instructor at the Inland Conservatory for the Performing Artists in Ontario, CA. He completed and installed a 16 ft. x 9-inch x 9 ft ceramic tile mural, which took three years to complete at the Foothill Country Day School in Claremont, CA, where the Middle School kids assisted. Gary created the third commemorative plaque art installation funded by Monrovia, CA, and is making a 54 ft x 6-inch x 11 ft custom ceramic tile mural for the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Park in Pomona, CA, this summer.

Intuitively, cultural diversity and appreciation are keystones in his approach to teaching and delivering his art impetus. Gary's mantra is, "Art is the glue that binds the fiber of society together, although sometimes loose and sometimes tight, we are all in this thing together.

Gary created the JCWWP logo and led many Art sessions during the JCWWP Dare to Dream program that Justin created to provide outlets for underserved students. Gary plans to expand his accessibility to teach youth and seniors and produce more public art installations. Gary has been married to Lisha, his bride, for over forty-four years, and they have two sons and eight grandchildren. @artbygaryvincentlett
