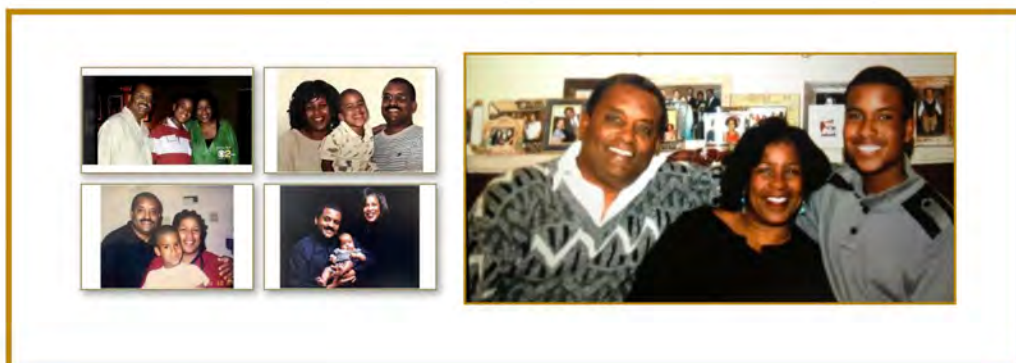
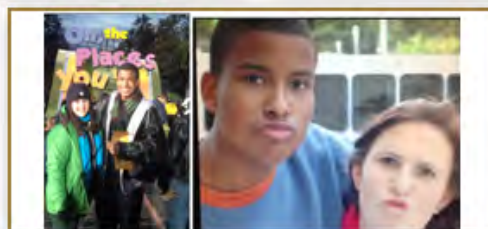
Darrell & Susan Carr

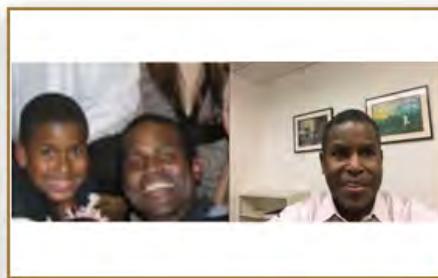
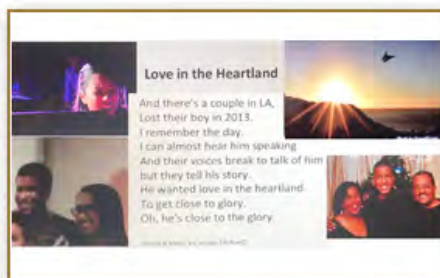
Taylor Nikki Drake, MD
